



# THREE CARD POKER GAMING GUIDE

## NOTES:

Three Card Poker is a new and exciting variation to the game of poker. The game is fast paced and easy to learn.

Before the first hand is dealt, a player may compete solely against the dealer by placing an Ante Wager in an amount within the minimum and maximum wagers posted at the table and then placing a Play Wager in an equal amount.

A player may compete solely against a posted payout table by placing a Pair Plus Wager, which may be in any amount within the minimum and maximum wagers posted at the table.

A player may compete against both the dealer and the posted payout table by placing both an Ante and Pair Plus Wager. All bets must be made prior to the dealer announcing "no more bets."

Each player and the dealer receive three cards face down. Players then look at their cards and decide whether to fold or continue playing by placing a Play Wager. Play Wagers must be equal to the Ante Wager. If a player does not make a Play Wager, the Ante and Pair Plus Wagers are lost.

The dealer must have a Queen high or higher to qualify. If the dealer does not qualify, the Ante Wager gets paid 1-1 and the Play Wager is returned. If the dealer qualifies, and the player's hand beats the dealer's hand, the Ante and Play Wagers win 1-1. In the event of a tie, the hand is declared a push and all wagers are returned..

## ANTE BONUS

When placing both Ante and Play Wagers, the following bonuses will be paid regardless if the player beats the dealer, or if the dealer does not qualify with Queen high or higher:

Straight Flush..... 5 to 1  
Three of a Kind..... 4 to 1  
Straight..... 1 to 1

### PAIR PLUS PAYOUTS

The Pair Plus Wager allows the player to wager on the ranked value of their hand as it is dealt. This wager is not in competition with the dealer's hand.

The payouts for a Pair Plus are as follows:

Straight Flush.....	40 to 1
Three of a Kind.....	30 to 1
Straight.....	6 to 1
Flush.....	3 to 1
Pair.....	1 to 1

An incorrect number of cards dealt to either the player or the dealer constitutes a misdeal. An exposed card in the player's hand does not constitute a misdeal. More than one exposed card constitutes a misdeal.

Ace is the highest ranking card except in 3-2-Ace sequence. Players may not exchange or communicate information regarding their hands. Any violation will result in a dead hand and forfeiture of wager.

If one or more of the dealer's cards is inadvertently exposed prior to the dealer revealing their hand, all hands shall be void and the cards reshuffled.

### SIX CARD BONUS WAGER

Three Card Poker Six Card Bonus features an optional bonus side bet called the Six Card Bonus Wager. This bonus side bet is based on the best 5-card poker hand that can be made from the six cards dealt to the dealer and player. Thus, each player uses his own 3 cards and combines them with the dealer's 3 cards.

The player is eligible to win this wager even if he folds his Ante/Play Wager.

The payouts are as follows:

Royal Flush.....	1,000 to 1
Straight Flush.....	200 to 1
Four of a Kind.....	50 to 1
Full House.....	25 to 1
Flush.....	15 to 1
Straight.....	10 to 1
Three of a Kind.....	5 to 1

### THREE CARD POKER RANKINGS

1. Straight Flush
2. Three of a Kind
3. Straight
4. Flush
5. Pair
6. High Card

### PROGRESSIVE WAGER

Three Card Poker Progressive features an optional side bet called a progressive wager. This optional \$1 progressive bet wins if you have a straight or higher. If you receive an Ace-King-Queen of spades, you win 100% of the progressive jackpot. Folded hands do not qualify for payouts on the progressive wager.

### PAYTABLE

A-K-Q Spades.....	100% of Jackpot Meter
A-K-Q Diamonds, Clubs or Hearts.....	500 for 1
Straight Flush.....	70 for 1
Three of a Kind.....	60 for 1
Straight.....	6 for 1

### ENVY BONUS

The Envy Bonus is an addition to the progressive wager where everyone placing a progressive wager will receive an Envy payout, when an Ace-King-Queen Straight Flush is dealt to another player. If the Ace-King-Queen is Spades the payout will be \$100, any other suit will receive \$25. You cannot receive an Envy Bonus payout for your own hand or the dealer's hand.
