Attention PID Horsemen:

Please familiarize yourself with the current 2024 entry requirements for the PID barn area.

- Horses who **reside in Pennsylvania and have not left in the past thirty (30) days** must present upon arrival:
 - o Negative Coggins dated within past 12 months
 - o Proof of vaccination for rhinopneumonitis (EHV) dated more than 14 days and less than 180 days
 - o Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Health Cert) within the past **5 days**
- Horses **coming from all states besides Ohio and Maryland** must present upon arrival:
 - o Negative Coggins dated within past 12 months
 - o Proof of vaccination for rhinopneumonitis (EHV) dated more than 14 days and less than 180 days
 - o Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Health Cert) within the past **72 hours**
- Horses that are **coming from, or have been in Ohio or Maryland in the past 30 days** must present upon arrival:
 - o Negative Coggins dated within past 12 months
 - o Proof of vaccination for rhinopneumonitis (EHV) dated more than 14 days and less than 180 days
 - o Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Health Cert) within the past **72 hours**
 - o Horses need to isolate for a minimum of seven (7) days at a private farm or facility approved by CDI Equine Medical Director Dr. Will Farmer, be monitored multiple times daily for an elevated temperature (>101.5), and then have negative test results for:
 - If horse is coming from **OHIO**, they must have a nasal pharyngeal wash collected and tested via PCR for STRANGLES no more than 24hrs prior to planned arrival at PID
 - If the horse is coming from **MARYLAND**, they must have a nasal swab and EDTA whole blood collected and tested via PCR for EQUINE HERPESVIRUS (EHV) no more than 24hrs prior to planned arrival at PID
 - o Negative results will need to be sent to Dr. Farmer, who will approve entry into the PID barn area at that time.
 - o Horses that leave PID to race in Ohio or Maryland will need to meet these requirements before returning to PID.
